beautiful flower arrangements in the Women's Changing Room and table decor for most events. They always look stunning and verv professional.
































We also would like to acknowledge the Rhododendron donation from Louise Glubb, which enhances the look of our Clubhouse entrance.



## **GOLF RULE**

Relief for ball in RED penalty area



When it is known or virtually certain that a ball is in a red penalty area and the player wishes to take relief, the player has three options, each for one penalty stroke. The player may:

- 1. Take <u>stroke-and-distance</u> relief by playing a ball from a relief area based on where the previous stroke was made.
- 2. Take <u>back-on-the-line</u> relief by dropping a ball outside the penalty area, keeping point X between the hole and the spot where the ball is dropped.
- Take lateral relief (red penalty area only).



































The <u>reference point</u> for taking relief is point X, and a ball must be dropped in and played from the two club-length relief area, which is no nearer the hole than point X

## WINTER GOLF - MOVE FORWARD

As the weather is getting colder and the fairways softer, we are getting less fairway run.

Please move forward, the Slate Course will give more opportunities for pars, enjoyable games and less frustration.

Maybe it is time to change your mindset: Our White course is 5476m and extremely long and because of it you are gaining a few strokes. 98.5% course rating is the length of the course and not just trees, water and bunkers.

The Slate Course (5066m) is 410 meters shorter, i.e. 3-4 less strokes. Remember it's only a color.

By the way, Pegasus Yellow course is 5066m and 410m shorter than our White course. Waimairi's Women's course is 4400m, that's nearly 1 km shorter than our white course. A survey tells us, in relation to golfing abilities, over 80% of golfers choose the wrong tee block.
